availability than ever.

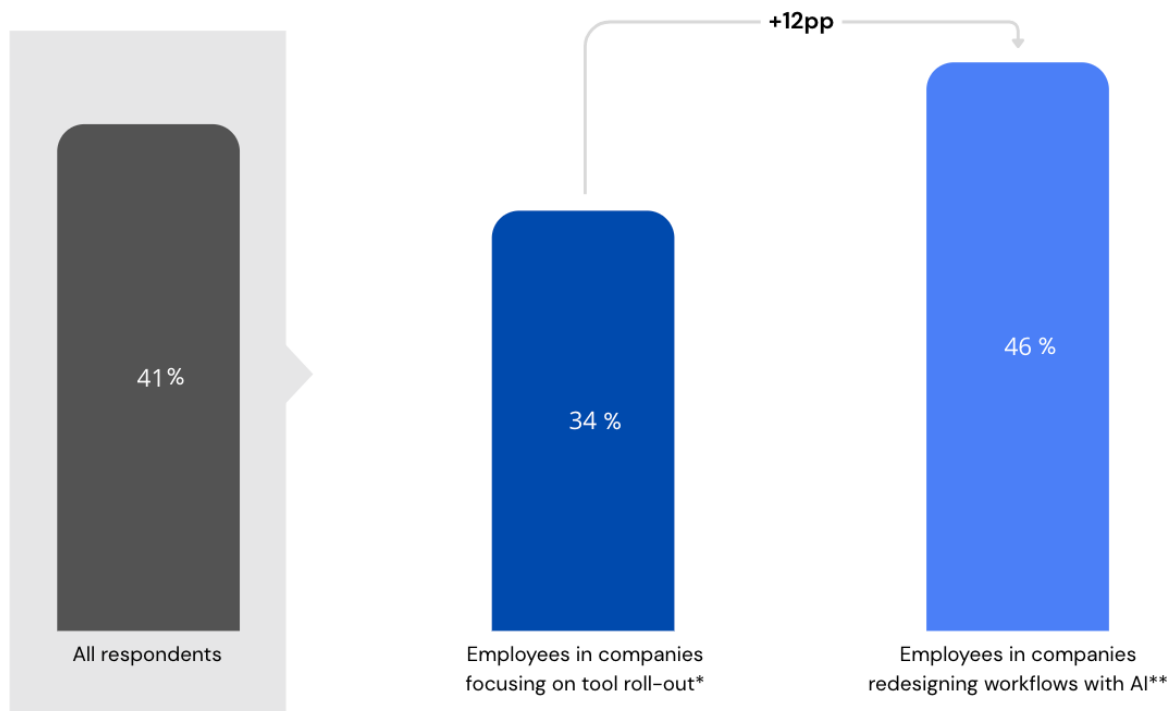
Add to this the emotional weight of AI:

- empower managers to reinforce learning

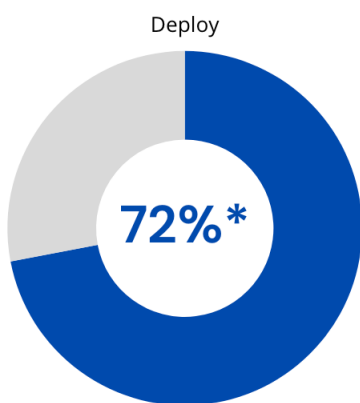
When leadership shifts, L&D breathes.

When leadership hesitates, L&D absorbs the shock.

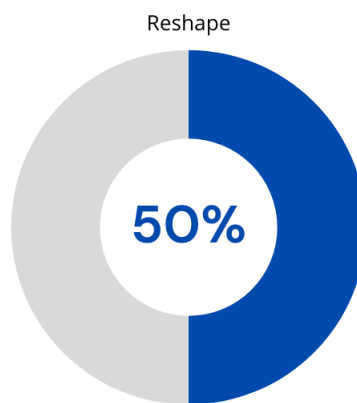
The Model Must Change — From Production to Enablement

The real pressure comes from a mismatch of operating models.

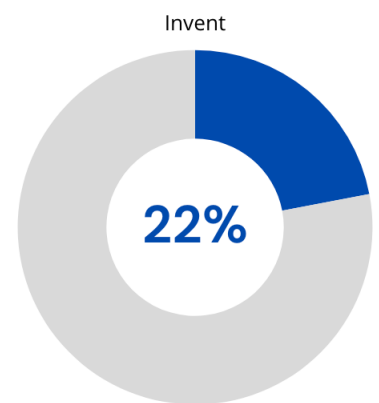
Half of respondents say their company is redesigning end-to-end workflows

Build and innovate new business models and products to drive growth (e.g., creating new revenue streams with AI-powered services)
